What does PBIS look like at Marshall?

- Posted and taught behavioral expectations
 - Matrices Inside
 - Matrices Outside
- Acknowledgement system
 - Marshall Stars are given to acknowledge students who meet expectations.
 - Daily winner is announced during morning announcements
 - Receives Marshall Star bracelet
 - Students turn Marshall Stars into a classroom bucket.
 - Weekly winners are chosen from each classroom and announced on Friday
 - Marshall Star certificate
 - Pencil
 - Monthly Golden Awards given at monthly assembly to acknowledge classroom behavior
 - Class picture

- Certificate for classroom
 - Classroom trophy for the month
- Social Emotional Learning
 - Steps to Respect
 - Stop & Think
- Positively correcting behavior
 - I expect you to...
 - I'm looking for...
- Corrective Response System
 - Behavior Flow Chart
 - Minor form
 - Major form
- Data based decision making
 - If the data shows a student struggling with behavior expectations, those students are provided with individualized support interventions.
